Recently in Week 10, students in Years 7 and 9 trialed our NAPLAN testing platform, which in 2021 is solely online. The online platform is becoming the preferred method of administering standardised tests and looking ahead, most - if not all - Senior SACE exams will be administered online. These trials allow students to become familiar with the process, the style of testing and using the software. I would like to thank Mr Daniel Stratford and Mr Darren Pitt for all their work in preparing the students and coordinating the trial test. The actual NAPLAN tests will be in Weeks 3 and 4 of Term 2, from Tuesday 11 May to Tuesday 18 May.


Middle/Senior School
