


The whole College celebrated Saint Columba Day with a special Liturgy on Friday, 9 June. This was a joyful occasion that involved both students and staff in prayer, song and the Word of God in our worship. We reflected on the theme of foundations. Luke 6:46-49 tells the story of two men who built their houses on different foundations: one on rock and one on sand. The house built with a rock foundation was kept strong amid the chaotic storm, while conversely, the house established on sand could not withstand the harsh conditions and collapsed.

This analogy is reflected in Saint Columba's life. When his actions were based on the firm foundation of love, he was fulfilled and had purpose. He was successful and brought happiness to those he encountered. Jesus teaches us that the foundation of all things is love, and if we act with love as our base, then we will always endeavour to do what is right in the world.
