Student Reward & Recognition Celebrations



This year saw the implementation of the Student Reward and Recognition policy, where students were recognised for their positive behaviour and choices. At St Columba College, we understand the importance of recognising those students who do the right thing. Many of our students regularly display positive behaviour and academic choices throughout the school day, and these are rewarded and acknowledged through the awarding of a Gold Slip.
